2020 has seen the novel coronavirus pandemic affect the entire world. In order to give fans of wushu a platform in which to pursue their goals during this difficult period, and in order to promote the tireless efforts in the development of wushu around the world, we are holding an online-only tournament this year. We hope that this will be a way to motivate and generate enthusiasm among fans of wushu! This goes especially for youth athletes, who will benefit from continued training and subsequent strengthening of their bodies and immune systems.

Thus, organized by Malee's School of Tai Chi & Kung Fu and sanctioned by the USA Wushu-Kungfu Federation, this year's New England International Chinese Martial Arts Championships will be an online event. We are inviting the highest caliber of wushu masters as judges. As usual, we have three experience levels (beginning, intermediate, and advanced) and many age groups, with event categories in modern wushu, traditional kung fu, taiji, bagua, xingyi, and liuhebafa, and long, short, and other weapons styles.

Registrations are open from October 1st through November 30th.

Videos of forms must be done in one take, but the competitor can record their form as many times as they like, selecting the best version of their performance to submit to us. Competitors can email submissions to us at info@newenglandchampionships.com, share a YouTube link, or use a service such as Dropbox to share a link where we can download video submissions.

All video submissions must be made by December 5th, after which time our judges will begin reviewing and scoring them.

After the conclusion of judging, we will publish all the results on our website; athletes will then receive certificates of participation and any medals they have won by mail. All competition videos will be available for review.

Finally, we warmly welcome martial arts enthusiasts from all over the world to participate, and we hope that this online martial arts event will be a great success. Thank you all for your support!
